Minutes of the February 14th, 2017 meeting of the Gateway Turners

Jim Silva opened the meeting at 7:00 with one visitor, Nigel Howe from South Shore Woodturners, who was demonstrating surface embellishment for us. 17 members were present.

Jim reminded members about the Totally Turning Symposium in Saratoga, N.Y., April 1 & 2. The AAW Symposium is in June in Kansas City, Missouri, June 22 -25.

The Cape Cod club will be having Stuart Batty demonstrate on April 22 & 23. Cost is \$40.00 including lunch.

The South Shore will have Demo Days also on April 22 & 23. It is \$35.00 including coffee break and lunch. There will be three demonstrations in the morning beginning at 9:00 and continuing after lunch with three more. They will have a raffle.

Lenny showed a Maple burl box w/Ebony finial, a Maple twisted vessel, an Oak burl, and a Walnut yarn bowl.



Jim Silva showed 3 box elder vessels stained orange, blue, and purple and also an Ambrosia Maple hollowform.



Bob Francis showed a Redwood yarn bowl, two open segmented vessels.

Note from Jeff about his bowl : *I watched a DVD featuring Jimmy Clewes entitled "Turn it on" part 2 in which he demonstrated turning this bowl. I made the inlay lines as he did in the video by using the point of a Bedan as the bowl turned on the lathe. I had shaped the outside but had purposely not hollowed out the inside as it might change the overall shape. Next I had some bronze powder in a pill container. I used two part epoxy as Clewes did and mixed a batch of the powder with the epoxy and then added the hardner. I slathered it over the rim and let it set overnight (the label says it is hard in an hour but I thought longer would be better). The next day I placed it back on the lathe and turned away the excess just as Clewes did. One thing different, this is Gumwood and it had some hair line cracks. I sealed them with thin CA and sawdust which stained the wood. I then sanded the surface down and used the Ca as a finish coating the whole surface with a bit of CA on a paper towel. I finished it with friction polish and wipe on poly sanding between applications. As the photo shows, the cracks only partially sealed.- Jeff Keller*
